

**MANIPUR FIRE SERVICE
ANNUAL ADMINISTRATION REPORT
FOR THE YEAR 2025-2026**

The Manipur Fire Service was established on 11th April 1957 as a part of the Police Department. On 1st May 1991, it was bifurcated from the Police Department and became a separate Directorate.

At present, the organisation has one Fire Station-cum-Headquarters in Imphal and 20 Fire Sub-Stations distributed across 12 District Headquarters and 8 Sub-Divisional Headquarters, with a total staff strength of 286 employees.

4) FIRE AND EMERGENCY CALLED RESPONDED: The Manipur Fire Service Department responded to 397 fire calls and 45 Special Service Calls, enabling the Department to save public property valued at approximately Rs.81.34 crore.

5) FLOOD RESCUE OPERATION: The Department carried out extensive rescue and relief operations in several flood-affected areas. A total of 1,059 individuals and animals were rescued and evacuated to safer locations, including 64 patients, 226 children, 77 elderly persons, 20 animals, and 672 other civilians.

At the peak of the floods, the Fire Service also assisted in transporting blood units and essential medical equipment from JNIMS to RIMS. Additionally, the Department distributed 2,08,000 litres of drinking water to affected areas.

6) AWARENESS GENERATION PROGRAM: Besides attending regular fire and rescue calls, the Manipur Fire Service is also working proactively on awareness generation programmes and conducts regular fire awareness and short-term training programmes for schools, hospitals, resident welfare societies, and government offices.

Altogether, 63,347 employees and volunteers from various hospitals, hotels, schools, industries, and local volunteer groups were trained to enhance public capacity in handling situations arising from both natural and man-made disasters.

The Department also conducted 1,514 fire mock drills at hospitals and school buildings across various hill and valley districts, as well as at Malom Oil Depot, Sekmai Bottling Plant, Imphal International Airport, oil pumps, hospitals, hotels, and malls, to promote preparedness and safety awareness.

8) 15TH FINANCE COMMISSION: A sum of Rs.40.50 Crs was released from the MHA for expansion and modernisation of fire services in the States. Out of which, Rs. 24.14 Crs including 10% state matching share was utilised for procurement 14 Water Tenders with search and rescue equipment, 4 Water Browsers with rescue equipment, 3 Mini Water Tenders equipped with water mist technology, 1 Water Tender with piercing facilities, 10 Motorcycles with water mist firefighting units, along with various training aids and equipment.

Under this scheme, construction of six new Fire Sub-Stations buildings at Khumbong, Porompat, Litan, Saikul, Yairpok, and Lilong will be commenced in due course.

9) BUDGETARY PROVISIONS: A sum of Rs.5517.30 lakhs, including salaries was allocated in the Budget Estimates for the year, 2025-26.
