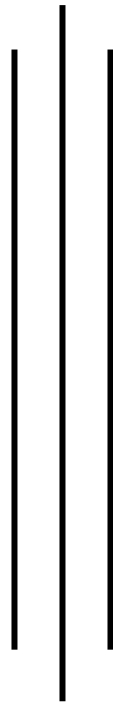

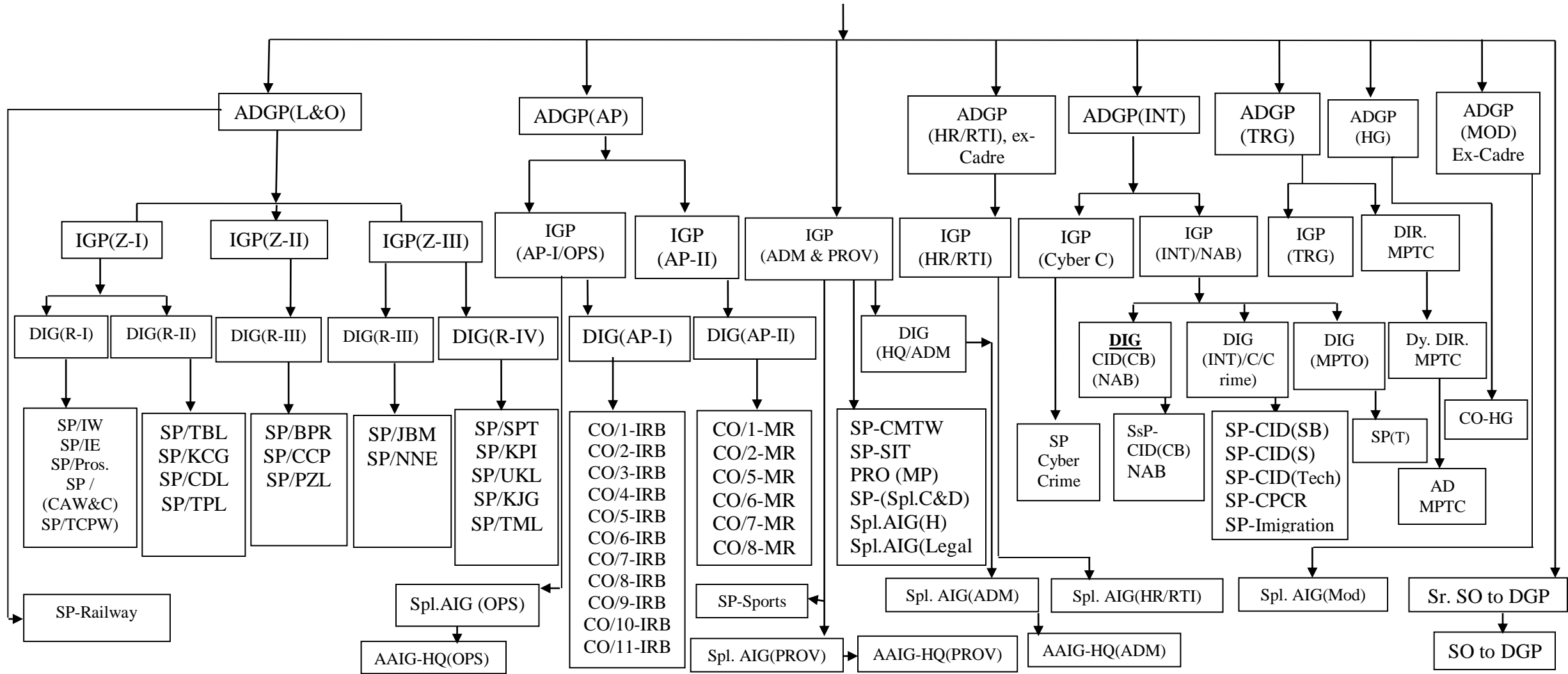

**1. INTRODUCTION**

Police Department, Manipur is functioning under the Director General of Police supported by officers of various ranks. He oversees functioning of District Police, Armed Battalions, Manipur Police Training College, Manipur Police Telecommunication Organization and various others specialized units. The organization structure of Police Department Manipur is given in Chart No.1.

- vi. Prevention of drug trafficking and illicit use of drugs and
- vii. Building trust between Police and Community.

Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems (CCTNS) is an e-Governance Mission Mode Project fully funded by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), Government of India.

• **Site Survey:**

Site Survey is completed at all 216 locations which includes (102 Police Stations and 115 Higher Offices).

• **Site Preparation / Client System Delivered**

Site Preparation, Hardware Delivery and Installation at all 216 locations have been completed by the System Integrator.

• **CAS Deployment**

CAS version 4.5 has been deployed at all locations. Online and Offline data entry is currently going on for 102 Police Stations. CAS customization of 5 different State specific modules is completed.

• **Data Replication to NDC**

SDC-NDC connectivity was established through NKN on 8th April, 2016. Data replication was started from 12<sup>th</sup> May, 2016 and data replication is going on smoothly on real time basis.

• **Disaster Recovery Centre (DRC) establishment & Data Replication**

DRC was established in 2015 at NIC, Shastri Park, New Delhi. SDC-DRC connectivity has been established through NKN Router on 28th April, 2017 and database replication has been started from 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2017. Data replication is going on smoothly on real time basis.

- **eSakshya :-** eSakshya system, a digital evidence management system, has been successfully implemented in the State on 5<sup>th</sup> March 2025.
- **eSign :-** eSign module has been successfully integrated with the CCTNS CAS application.
- **iRAD :-** iRAD (Integrated Road Accident Database) application has been integrated with the CCTNS CAS application and now implemented since 12<sup>th</sup> January,2026.

## BEST ACHIEVEMENTS –

- One FIR No. 83/2025 of City PS, Imphal West district is included in the exemplary 50 success stories of Nyaya Sanhita compiled by BPR&D, MHA, New Delhi of all States/UTs. The case is a remarkable example of same-day investigation, trial, and judgment under the Nyaya Sanhita framework. The accused was apprehended during Naka checking and confessed to theft on the spot. Electronic seizure documentation using the e-Sakshya platform ensured transparency. The entire justice process from FIR to conviction was completed within a single day.

### **7.3 State Finger Print Bureau (SFPB):**

#### **Overview: -**

The State Fingerprint Bureau (SFPB), Manipur, functioning under SP/CID(CB) as ex-Officio Director, is the technical support arm of the State Police in the domain of Fingerprint science. The Bureau provides identification, examination, comparison and court expert services in fingerprint evidence and deploys Scene of Crime (SOC) team for on-site crime scene examination.

National Automated Fingerprint Identification System (NAFIS) District level is already operational in all the districts. However, due to logistic problem like network connectivity, the NAFIS usage in the state is low.

20 (twenty) numbers of MCU (Measurement Collection Unit) systems are installed in 16 (sixteen) Districts & 4 (four) units out of which 14 (fourteen) are operational / functional. 470 (four hundred & seventy) numbers of accused have been enrolled in the MCUs (Measurement Collection Unit) system

#### **7.4 Police Station for Economic Offences/Investigation Section:**

The Economic Offences Wing of CID (Crime Branch) is mandated to investigate serious cases of cheating, fraud, misappropriation, forgery, and financial crimes. During 2025-26, the unit successfully completed investigation and filed charge sheets in five major fraud cases involving crores of rupees and 2 (two) cases were returned in Final Report (FR) during the said period.

### **8. CYBER CRIME POLICE STATION, CYBER CRIME, MANIPUR**

#### **8.1 Achievements:**

1. During the period, 39 (thirty-nine) FIR cases were registered during the period.
2. 8(Eight) accused persons were arrested during the period.
3. During the period, 13 FIR cases were charge sheeted and 5 cases were returned in F.R. Also, 673 enquiry cases had been closed.
4. About 347 numbers of lost mobile phones were recovered, which has approximate value of around Rs. 52,05,000/-.
5. Cyber Crime PS, Manipur has also been handling the Cybercrime Customer Care Call Centre 1930 for assisting the complainant for any complaint made through National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (NCRP). With the help of the portal, cyber police team have been able to freeze various amounts of fraud money very effectively.
6. A total amount of approximately Rs 2.96 Crores was saved out of total frauded amount of approximately Rs. 13.63 Crores for the 1636 complaints reported through NCRP portal, which has a recovery rate of about 21.7%
7. Some of the FIR cases cracked in a very short period of time are:
  - (a) In c/w FIR No. 37(9)2025 CCPS u/s 319(2)/318(4)/61(2)/3(5) BNS, 2(two) accused persons who were conducting fraudulent activities by using a number of mule bank accounts had been arrested and charge sheet has also been submitted.

- (b) In c/w FIR No. 42(10)2025 CCPS U/s 79/75(2)(3) BNS 67B IT Act regarding circulation of obscene photos and videos of the victim, the accused person was arrested in a very short period of time and charge sheet of the case has also been submitted.
- (c) In c/w FIR No. 44(12)2025 CCPS u/s 79/78(2) BNS and 67A/67B IT Act regarding circulation of obscene photo and video of the victim, one accused person was arrested and charge sheet of the case has also been submitted.
- (d) In c/w FIR No. 46(12)2025 CCPS u/s 75(2)(3)/77/79/351(2)(3) BNS and 67A IT Act regarding circulation of obscene photo and video of the victim, one accused person was arrested and charge sheet of the case has also been submitted.

### **8.2 Social Media Monitoring**

1. During the period, Cyber Crime Police Team and social media monitoring team of Cyber Crime Manipur have been actively monitoring (24x7) the social media uploads and post comments on various social media platforms, viz, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, YouTube, WhatsApp, etc. to identify the posts which are of anti-social elements, hate speech, false narrative and inciting violence.
2. The team have been able to identify about 1459 posts which are anti-social, hate speech, false narrative, inciting violence contents and out of these posts, 778 posts links have been taken down.
3. Also, 89 numbers of social media accounts/pages, which posted anti-social elements, hate speeches, false narrative, inciting violence, have been taken down taken down by coordinating with the Department of Information Technology, Manipur.

### **8.3 Awareness and Training Program**

Various initiatives have been taken up to prevent cyber related crimes by giving awareness to the general public at various institutions, media channels, public places, etc. and also through official social media handles. During the period, Cyber Crime Police Station, Manipur have conducted 14 numbers of awareness programmes at various institutions/government departments and public places like mela grounds, etc.

### **8.4 Technical assistance provided by the Cyber Crime Police Station**

During the period, Cyber Crime Police Station, Manipur have provided 31 numbers of technical assistance to different police stations of Manipur enabling to identify accused person(s); in procurement of digital evidence from different nodal officer of different service providers; also assisted in various missing person cases, which enable the police stations to find the missing persons.

## 8.5 Targets

1. To conduct awareness program every month and to give online cybercrime awareness from time to time through official Social Media Account/Pages handled by Cyber Crime, Manipur.
2. To dispose off more cases.
3. To attend every calls received through 1930 Cyber Helpline No. and assist the victims in reporting their complaints through NCRP portals.
4. To increase money recovery percentage with effective use of NCRP portal in connection with economic offence cases.
5. To identify the accused persons and recover fraudulently transacted money in economic fraud cases.
6. To block the fake websites, fraudulent apps, mule bank accounts used in fraudulent activities, mobile numbers associated with extortion, fraudulent activities. etc.
7. To monitor various social media platforms actively 24x7 for any anti-social, communal, hate speech, fake news post, etc. on the social media and take necessary steps to tackle such un-wanted social media posts.

2. Provided plain clothes security arrangement for Lok Bhavan, Imphal, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Manipur and CMO cum residential office.

## **12. NARCOTICS AND AFFAIRS OF BORDER (NAB), MANIPUR**

### **12.1 Objective**

To make Manipur a drug free State through a three-pronged strategy as mentioned below:

- (i) Supply reduction,
- (ii) Demand reduction and
- (iii) Harm reduction.

### **12.2 Function and Duties of NAB, Manipur.**

- 1) Specialized unit to implement provisions of NDPS Act.
- 2) To conduct regular drug drives.
- 3) To conduct illegal poppy/cannabis destruction drives.
- 4) To compile all the data for the state related with ND & PS.
- 5) It plays the vital role of co-ordination with NCB office, Social Welfare Department, District Police, other Units/Agencies etc.
- 6) It also conducts wide range of awareness programmes against Drugs all over the state.
- 7) Rehabilitation of substance users.
- 8) Secretariat of State NCORD/ANTF
- 9) Compilation of various Action Taken Reports of the state in connection with NDPS.

### **12.3 WAY FORWARD/RECOMMENDATIONS TO TACKLE THE ISSUE OF DRUG MENACE IN THE STATE:**

We have to see the solution for drug abuse and drug trafficking in Manipur from 3 perspectives:

- A. *Supply reduction:* Controlling and limiting the supply and availability of illicit narcotic drugs as well as that of prescription drugs.
- B. *Demand reduction:* Reducing the local demand/market for these illegal drugs through various means like creating awareness etc.
- C. *Harm reduction:* Treating and weaning those already addicted to dangerous drugs.

### **12.4 Supply Reduction**

- State Drug Policy formulated by State Government.
- Data/list of the areas/villages of Manipur where illegal poppy were cultivated are compiled.
- List/details of all the arrested persons in connection with NDPS cases of Manipur are compiled.
- Detailed guidelines on ND&PS cases and technical procedures along with check list circulated.
- Fast track and Special ND&PS courts setup. The State has six designated NDPS courts.
- Many habitual drug offenders are detained under PIT NDPS Act 1988.
- ANTF for all 16 districts of Manipur has been set up.
- Random frisking/checking conducted on daily basis at various places by NAB, Manipur.
- Sniffer dogs utilised in frisking/checking.
- Four online training programmes on NDPS Investigations and its various aspects for the IOs of all Police Stations of Manipur were done by NAB in the month April 2025.
- Case studies of convicted NDPS cases of NAB-PS prepared and circulated to district SsP for reference and guidance.

### 12.5 Demand Reduction:

- District level NCORD meetings are held regularly. So far 104 meetings have been held.
- Alternative livelihood programmes for poppy affected areas by State Government.
- Awareness programmes against drugs were conducted throughout the year.

The following are the awareness programme conducted by Manipur Police.

- Schools,
- Colleges,
- Pledge against drugs administered at various educational institutions across the state,
- Rehabilitation centres,
- Jails,
- Months long posters campaign against drugs,
- Awareness through sporting activities, environmentalist, sport stars, singers etc.
- Video shows on sign/symptoms of subsequent mean to students,
- Teachers / Staff of school sensitised.
- Anti-drug signages are also pasted at different hotels, shops, restaurants, salons, petrol pumps etc.
- More than 400 such shops/hotels etc. are covered.
- Framed Anti-Drug signages were also handed over to various hotels viz Classic, Sangai etc. by NAB.
- Anti-Drug signages are also displayed for months at the Smart/E-board installed at Western Gate of Kangla.

### 12.6 Harm Reduction:

Numerous drug dependents are being kept at various rehabilitation centres from time to time by Manipur Police for their treatment and wellbeing.

  - b) One day training on three Criminal Laws and NDPS for NAB on 26/09/2025 at SP Office NAB, Manipur.
  - c) One day training on three Criminal Laws and NDPS for NAB on 29/10/2025 at SP Office NAB, Manipur.

## **13. MANIPUR POLICE TELECOMMUNICATION ORGANISATION (MPTO)**

### **13.1 Introduction**

Manipur Police Wireless Organization, enshrined as Manipur Police Telecommunication Organization (MPTO) w.e.f. 01/01/2012, was established on the 9 April, 1956 with the basic motto to provide uninterrupted secured Wireless Communication, 24x7 round the year and for handling of law & order messages of Police Department. Besides, Manipur Police Communication grid has been rendering yeoman's service since its inception to assist the Civil Administration by handling non-law & order messages round the year to facilitate effective governance in the remote areas of hill districts in particular and in the state of Manipur in general for the past 70 years and forever committed to continue to do so.

Manipur Police Telecommunication Organization functions as a specialized professional Telecommunication Agency working under a statutory act and maintains a complex Hybrid Network comprising of Analog and Digital Technology in VHF/UHF band. It is a matter of pride to state that Manipur is the first state in North-East where 100% digitization from Analog to Digital Platform in police communication have been achieved using DMR tier II Technology. The advantage of DMR Technology is clarity, high security, high speed, interception free and future upgradation feature both for voice & data communication. However, NH-37 communication is an indigenously developed mission mode: Communication for security and Armed Police personnel escorting movement of essential goods and lifesaving drugs between Jiribam and Imphal route throughout the year, operating in analog mode. It is delivering the much-needed service of our security forces but the same needs to be upgraded to Digital mode for security reasons with value added infrastructure and gadgets with roaming and GIS compatibility features.

### **14. MANIPUR POLICE DOG SQUAD**

Manipur Police Dog Squad was established vide Government Order No. 9/6(16)/16-H(MP/DS) dated 31/12/2016. 4(four) Belgian Malinois trained dogs have been added to Manipur Police Dog Squad at Lamphel by Shri L.M. Khaute, IPS, the then, Director General of Police, Manipur on 20/01/2020. Now, the 4(four) Belgian Malinois dogs along with the previously trained 2(two) dogs are being used for detection of explosives, narcotics, etc.

#### **For proper maintenance and smooth functioning of the Dog Squad: -**

- i) The Superintendent of Police, CID(Technical), Manipur is the Nodal Officer as far as operational aspect of the Manipur Police Dog Squad is concerned.
- ii) The Manipur Police Dog Squad is under the overall charge of Commandant, 2<sup>nd</sup> MR, Imphal as far as the maintenance, feeding, care, security, ensuring discipline of the dog handlers/staff and the overall functioning are concerned.
- iii) The JCO/NCO detailed for overall in-charge of the Dog Squad by CO/2<sup>nd</sup> MR also head the K-9 Control Room, which also includes the dog handlers as members staff. Their mobile phone numbers is displayed at the Control Room and in the offices of SP/CID(Tech) and CO/2<sup>nd</sup> MR. The mobile phone numbers of concerned officers of CID(Tech) and CO/2<sup>nd</sup> MR is also be prominently displayed at the Control Room.
- iv) ADGP(Int), Manipur, supervises the overall functioning of the Dog Squad. He is empowered to utilize the services of any officer to assist him.

## **15. CENTRAL MOTOR TRANSPORT WORKSHOP (CMTW):**

1. The Central Motor Transport Workshop (CMTW), established for the maintenance of Police Department vehicles, carried out extensive repair and maintenance activities during the period. During this period, the office of the SP/CMTW has completed 31 major repairs, 36 minor repairs and 73 servicing of vehicles. In addition, the office also conducted inspections of **1,085 tyres and tubes** and **415 batteries**.
2. 3 (three) Constable/Fitters namely K. Kritamala Singh, Ch. Inaocha Singh and Lalramchhana were promoted to the rank of Head Constable (Fitter) on 03/02/2026.
3. 1(one) Insp. (MT), 1(one) SI/F, 1(one) ASI/F, 2(two) HC/F, 1(one) C/F, 1(one) follower of CMTW, Imphal were retired on attaining the age of superannuation. They are (i) O. Yaima Singh – w.e.f 28/02/2025, (ii) Th. Biramani Singh w.e.f- 31/01/2026, (iii) L. Dorendro Singh w.e.f 31/01/26, (iv) Kh. Bimol Singh w.e.f. 31/12/2025, (v) N. Lakmani Singh w.e.f. 31/01/2026, (vi) Y. Jiten Singh w.e.f. 31/01/2026 and (vii) Ginkhanthang w.e.f. 28/02/25 respectively.
4. During the period, Manipur Police Department received 4 (four) nos. of Mahindra Thar purchased through GeM Portal from M/S Apex Motor Enterprise (Authorised Dealor Mahindra & Mahindra Ltd), Half Nagarjan, Dimapur, Nagaland. The Office of the SP/CMTW had assisted the PHQ and the concerned Line Committee in necessary procedures including arranging, cleaning, checking, inspection, allotment and documentation of the new vehicles. The office of the SP/CMTW has also received the following vehicles from **Mother's Blessing (Authorised Dealer of Hero MotoCorp Ltd.), Ghari Airport Road, Imphal, Manipur** and **Shivz Autotech Pvt. 6. Construction of storage shed for storing of unused tyres on 29/09/2025 and Renovation of 8 (eight) doors of the store room used for storing batteries, tyres and vehicles parts of DGP Pool was done on 7/12/2025 and 28/01/2026.
7. A Wash Basin was installed for the use of personnel at the CMTW office premises on 23/10/2025.
8. Blacktopping of the road connecting the approach to the administrative office was carried on 05/12/2025.

9. Ten (10) fire extinguishers were procured and installed in the following sections: (i) Gas Godown – 3, (ii) Workshop – 3, (iii) Administrative Building – 2, (iv) Unit Pool Store – 1, and (v) Recreation Hall – 1. Jiten Singh of CMTW were detailed as drivers for transportation of parade contingent representing Manipur Police in the Independence Day Celebration Parade, 2025 in Assam and, C/D No. 10D0713 Md. Habibur Rahaman was detailed as fitter/mechanic for accompanying the Parade Contingent representing Manipur Police in the Republic Day Celebration Parade, 2026 in Tripura.

11. ## **16. HOME GUARDS**

### **16.1. Introduction:**

The Manipur Home Guards (VA) is a voluntary service, raised first in Manipur on 6<sup>th</sup> December, 1963, to assist the Police in controlling civil disturbance and communal riots. The role of Home Guards is to serve as an auxiliary force to the Civil Police in maintenance of internal security situations, help the community in any kind of emergency such as an air-raid, fire, cyclone, earthquake, epidemic, natural disaster etc., help in maintenance of essential services, promote communal harmony and assist the administration in protecting weaker sections, participate in socio-economic and welfare activities and perform civil defence duties.

The Government of Manipur vide its order No.8/14(49)/2000-II(Pt) dated 21<sup>st</sup> October, 2003 had fixed the maximum call out strength of Manipur Home Guard volunteers of Manipur State as 2000(two thousand) Nos. w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2003. The Manipur Home Guards Organization has its regular staff and the volunteers i.e. the Home Guard volunteers.

Total Sanctioned Strength - 2000  
Total posted strength - 1717

### 16.2. Achievements:

1. Medical camps are organized at the Battalion Head Quarters for the Home Guard personnel.
2. Sainik Sammelans are conducted monthly to discuss the grievances of the sepoys and Home Guard volunteers to address timely.
3. Checking of Battalions and out posts of the Home Guards were carried out to look after their grievances and addressed accordingly.
4. Construction of shed is being undertaken for the Gate RP to protect from rain and heat.
5. Indoor games were conducted for the Home Guard volunteers.
6. Financial awareness program, Drug awareness program were also organized for the Home Guard volunteers from time to time.
7. Refresher Courses are conducted batch wise at Battalion Head Quarters to impart discipline and physical fitness.
8. Land filling was done to reduce frequent flooding in the campus.
9. 2(two) barracks and 1(one) toilet were renovated.

### 16.3. Targets:

1. To acquire highest level of discipline among the Home Guards volunteers and also improve their efficiency and effectiveness.
2. To reduce absenteeism at all level.
3. To address issues/problems faced by personnel and Home Guards of this battalion timely for effective and efficient conduct of duty.
4. To construct office complex under SASCI Scheme.

## **18. Crimes Against Women & Children (CAW & C):**

### **➤ Brief of the Unit**

- The office of Superintendent of Police - Crime Against Women & Children, Manipur was established on 16<sup>th</sup> February, 2021 as an ex-cadre post by an order of Hon'ble Governor of Manipur to address the urgent functional requirements of Manipur Police Department in response to the rising trend of crime against women & children.
- Presently, the office works as the central hub for several critical state wide initiative such as :-
  - a) State Nodal Officer of Women Help Desks.
  - b) State Nodal Officer of National Commission for Protection of Child Rights MIS Portal
  - c) Matters concerning the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act, 2005
  - d) National Commission for Women Portal
  - e) Khoya-Paya Portal (child tracking portal in c/w missing children)

### **➤ Recent Developments and Achievements**

- In order to enhance the ease and accessibility of police for women, Women Help Desks (WHDs) have been established in every functional police stations of the State. At present, 92 (ninety-two) Women Help Desks (WHDs) have been established to meet the requirements.
- 83 nos. of Laptops are procured from the funds of Women Help Desks (WHDs) by PHQ and distributed to Police Stations for use of Women Help Desks (WHDs). Distributed laptops are monitored through respective district Nodal Officers by giving instructions for ensuring strict use in Women Help Desks (WHDs) operations.
- In addition, 10 iron almirah, tables & chairs and New Criminal law books procured from the funds of Women Help Desks (WHDs) by PHQ have been distributed to Women Help Desks (WHDs) set up in police stations.
- This office also maintains a comprehensive database relating to crime against women and children by compiling and analyzing data received from District Superintendents of Police (SsP).
- As State Nodal Officer of WHD, requirements for smooth functioning of WHDs submitted by concerned police stations are also conveyed to PHQ for procurement from the funds of WHD if possible.
- Data/information related with JJ Act, POCSO Act and RTE Act uploaded by district Nodal Officer of NCPCR's MIS Portal is validated by the office of SP/CAW&C as State Nodal Officer of NCPCR's MIS Portal.
- Assistance of legal experts will also be sought to explain any legal issues.

### **➤ Target**

- As per guidelines of Ministry, Women Help Desk (WHD), should be headed by a female officer. Currently, shortage of female personnel has led to male officers leading Women Help Desks (WHDs) in various hill and valley districts.
