Friday, the 25th March 2022

The House assembled at 09:00 am of Friday, the 25th March, 2022 in the Assembly Hall with the Hon'ble Speaker, Shri Th. Satyabrata Singh in the Chair.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Hon'ble Chief Minister, 5 Cabinet Ministers and 52 Elected Members.

PAPERS LAID ON THE TABLE OF THE HOUSE:

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister laid the following papers on the Table of the House:-

- i) Report No.2 of 2021- Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on "Social, Economic (Other than Public Sector Undertakings), Economic (Public Sector Undertakings), Revenue and General Sectors" for the year ended 31st March, 2019.
- ii) Finance Accounts (Volume I) 2019-20, Government of Manipur.
- iii) Finance Accounts (Volume II) 2019-20, Government of Manipur.
- iv) Appropriation Accounts 2019-20, Government of Manipur.
- v) State Finances Audit Report (Report No. 3 of 2021) for the year 2019-20.
- vi) The Manipur Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) (Amendment) Rules, 2020.
- vii) 49th Annual Administrative Report of the Manipur Public Service Commission.

INTIMATION BY THE SECRETARY:

The Secretary, Manipur Legislative Assembly intimated the House that the "Report of the House Committee to enquire into the fraudulent withdrawal of money in the Department of TA & Hills Development, Government of Manipur" was submitted to the Hon'ble Speaker of the 11th Manipur Legislative Assembly on 30th December, 2021 as the House was not in session. Since the 11th Assembly was dissolved, he further informed that the same has been laid on the Table of the House as per convention.

GENERAL DISCUSSION ON DEMANDS FOR SUPPLEMENTARY GRANTS, DISCUSSION AND VOTING ON SUPPLEMENTARY DEMANDS FOR GRANTS: 2021-22

The Hon'ble Speaker clubbed the General Discussion on Supplementary Demands for Grants and Discussion and Voting on Supplementary Demands for a joint discussion.

Shri L.M. Khaute, MLA initiating the discussion urged the government to provide safe drinking water to the public of Churachandpur and provide compensation to the victims of wild

animal attacks. He reiterated the demand of the people of Churachandpur to set up Manipur University South Campus at Churachandpur and further expressed the need to organize pony and dog shows to promote and conserve indigenous breeds. He further pointed out among other things, the need to provide mini fire tenders at Churachandpur, provide budget for construction, preservation, promotion and maintenance of ethnic museums for each tribe in the state. He further urged the government to provide cold storage facilities in each district.

Shri K. Ranjit Singh, MLA participating in the discussion stressed the need to release the 13th month salaries of active service personnel and pending honorarium of NHM staff. He further enquired about releasing of 3rd phase of Housing scheme under PMAY and also the pending bills to those contractors under PWD. He also urged the government to improve the Wabagai-Sugnu-Chakpikarong road.

Shri Kh. Joykisan, MLA urged the government to release the pending bills for the works taken up under PWD. He also stressed the need for proper waste management in Municipality areas and further opined that funds from MLA LADF be allowed to be utilized for renovation of government schools.

Shri Surjakumar Okram, MLA participating in the discussion observed that the budget is not that realistic and urged the government to properly consult with experts while preparing the budget. Citing references of crime against women and grievances of the victim's families, he urged for the proper utilization of the Nirbhaya Fund.

Shri Th. Arunkumar, MLA participating in the discussion urged the need for proper supply of drinking water to the people of his constituency.

Md. Abdul Nasir, MLA participating in the discussion drew the attention of the Leader of the House to make a proper policy for the welfare of street vendors and added that accurate measures be taken for proper implementation of government's effort on the 'War on Drugs'.

Shri Th. Lokeshwar Singh, MLA while giving observation during the discussion urged the government to repair the Sawombung-Keibi road and opined to install a Fire Station in every Assembly Constituency.

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister making his clarification informed that repairing of the potholes in Wabagai-Sugnu road is underway and that a proposal under CRF regarding renovation of the stretch of road has already been initiated. Almost 63% of the construction work at Chingkhei Ching Water Supply Scheme is completed and sufficient tap water would be available to the people after its completion, he added. Considering the alarming situation of drug abuse, he informed that an Anti-Narcotics Task Force headed by an IGP has been constituted to tackle the menace of narcotics in the state.

All the Supplementary Demands were passed by the House unanimously.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE:

Hon'ble Speaker made an announcement that Shri N. Kayisii, MLA had applied for leave of absence for the day.

The House agreed and leave was granted.

DISCUSSION AND VOTING ON MOTION FOR VOTE ON ACCOUNT:

Shri Th. Biswajit Singh, Minister moved for passing the Vote on Account, 2022 which was presented in the House on 24th March, 2022.

The Vote on Account, 2022 was passed by the House.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS:

(i) Shri Thongam Biswajit Singh, Hon'ble Minister moved for leave to introduce the Manipur Appropriation (No.1) Bill, 2022.

The House granted leave and the Bill was introduced.

(ii) Shri Thongam Biswajit Singh, Hon'ble Minister moved for leave to introduce the Manipur Appropriation (No.2) Bill, 2022.

The House granted leave and the Bill was introduced.

Hon'ble Speaker, Shri Th. Satyabrata Singh adjourned the House at 10:35 am till 11:00 am of Thursday, the 26th March, 2022.
