4. Discussion and Voting on Demands for Grants, 2023-2024.

(I) DEMAND NO. 22 - PUBLIC HEALTH ENGINEERING :

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move :

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 2223,44,81,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2024 in respect of Demand No. 22 - Public Health Engineering."

MOTION FOR DISAPPROVAL OF POLICY CUT :

S/Shri K. Ranjit Singh, K. Meghachandra Singh and Th. Lokeshwar Singh, MLAs to move :-

"that the amount of the demand be reduced to Re.1/-"

On account of :-

- (i) Non-availability of potable water.
- (ii) Lack of quality control of potable water.
- (iii) Ineffective implementation of Har Ghar Jal (House to House drinking water) under Jal Jeevan Mission.
- (iv) Non-replacement of old distribution water pipes.
- (v) Need to check and control private water suppliers.
- (vi) Non-payment of liability bills.

(II) DEMAND NO. 26 - ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE :

(IV) DEMAND NO. 36 - MINOR IRRIGATION :

“that a sum not exceeding Rs. 302,76,41,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2024 in respect of Demand No. 36 - Minor Irrigation.”

“that a sum not exceeding Rs. 62,55,00,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2024 in respect of Demand No. 37 - Fisheries.”

“that a sum not exceeding Rs. 53,71,49,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2024 in respect of Demand No. 41 - Art and Culture.”

On account of :-

- (i) Inadequate infrastructure in Manipur University of Culture.

- (iii) Inability to preserve State's archaeological sites.
- (iv) Non-recognition of Manipuri films as an industry.
- (v) Misutilisation of Palace Auditorium against the objectives of MSFDS.
- (vi) Inability to start regular degree courses in the Manipur State Film and Television Institute.
- (vii) Inability to open District Art and Culture Offices.
- (viii) Inability to execute various activities reflected in the objectives of Manipur State Kala Academy.
- (ix) Inability to start construction of Manipur University of Culture campus at the allotted land.
- (x) Non-constitution of the Cultural Advisory Board under Manipur Cultural Policy.
