- (I) DEMAND NO. 11 - MEDICAL, HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE SERVICES:  
Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move :

*"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 1482,22,55,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023 in respect of Demand No. 11 - Medical, Health and Family Welfare Services."*

### MOTION FOR DISAPPROVAL OF POLICY CUT:

S/Shri K. Ranjit Singh, K. Meghachandra Singh, Th. Lokeshwar Singh and Surjakumar Okram, MLAs to move :-

*"that the amount of the demand be reduced to Re. 1/-"*

### On account of :-

- (i) Inadequate number of doctors, paramedics and nurses in majority of Government Health centres causing treatment of patients unviable.
- (ii) Inconvenience faced by general public due to non-attendance of doctors and other medical staffs at their respective places of posting.
- (iii) Inability to implement the 7<sup>th</sup> pay Commission recommendation in J.N Institute of Medical Sciences (Revised Pay) Rules, 2019 in respect of employees of JNIMS.
- (iv) Inability to fill up 78 vacant posts of "Nursing Sisters".
- (v) Inability to regularize doctors, nurses, drivers, MTS and others engaged in combating Covid-19 pandemic on daily wages/ contract basis.
- (vi) Inability to construct Imphal East district Hospital at Sagolmang.
- (vii) Lack of proper policy to appoint Medical officers (MOs) and Paramedical staffs.
- (viii) Inability to fill up vacancies of doctors, nurses and paramedics.
- (ix) Lack of appreciation for frontline Covid warriors.
- (x) Lack of manpower and infrastructure.

(II) DEMAND NO. 13 - LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT :

*“that a sum not exceeding Rs. 419,94,50,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023 in respect of Demand No. 13- Labour and Employment.”*
