(i) DEMAND NO. 7 - POLICE:

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move:

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 3112,68,23,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2025 in respect of Demand No. 7 - Police."

(ii) DEMAND NO. 24 - VIGILANCE & ANTI-CORRUPTION DEPARTMENT:

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move:

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 6,47,01,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2025 in respect of Demand No. 24 - Vigilance & Anti-Corruption Department."

(iii) DEMAND NO. 31 - FIRE PROTECTION AND CONTROL:

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move:

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 58,41,63,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2025 in respect of Demand No. 31 - Fire Protection and Control."

(iv) DEMAND NO. 32 - JAILS:

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 44,83,29,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2025 in respect of Demand No. 32 - Jails."

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move:

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 57,56,19,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2025 in respect of Demand No. 33 - Home Guards."

Shri N. Biren Singh, Chief Minister (in-charge of Finance) to move:

"that a sum not exceeding Rs. 13,85,20,000/- be granted to defray the charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year ending 31st March, 2025 in respect of Demand No. 34 - Rehabilitation."

Imphal, the 8th August, 2024

(I) DEMAND NO. 7 - POLICE:

Motion for disapproval of policy cut to be moved by the Members for reasons as stated below:-

“that the amount of the demand be reduced to Re. 1/-”

On account of :-

(A) Shri Okram Ibobi Singh:

- i. Inability to resolve the ongoing crisis.
- ii. Inability to prevent influx of illegal immigrants.
- iii. Inability to stop poppy plantation.

(B) Shri K. Ranjit Singh:

- i. Inability to take decisive action in the early stage of the ongoing crisis.
- ii. Misinformation regarding implementation of NRC.
- iii. Failure in the chain of command in organising police personnel.

(C) Shri Th. Lokeshwar Singh:

- i. Inability to maintain law and order.
- ii. Lack of power of the State security forces in controlling the ongoing crisis.
- iii. Inability to check the duties of Central Para Military forces in the State.
- iv. Ineffective measures for detection and deportation of illegal immigrants.
- v. Lack of policy for increment of the monthly salaries of VDF personnel.

(D) Shri K. Meghachandra Singh:

Failure to protect the lives and properties of people.

(E) Shri Surjakumar Okram:

- i. Failure to increase the ration money of police personnel from Rs. 2000 to 2500.
- ii. Failure to disburse the allowance of Rs.5000 for commando personnel and Rs.3000 for police personnel deployed in vulnerable areas on pro-rata basis.
- iii. Inability to complete the recruitment process of Jemadars of 10th and 11th IRBs.
- iv. Failure to increase the remuneration of the VDF personnel.
- v. Delay in appointment under Die-in Harness scheme in the Department.
- vi. Delay in giving promotions from Constable to Head constable.
- vii. Inefficient management of security personnel in the ongoing crisis.

(II) DEMAND NO. 48 - RELIEF AND DISASTER MANAGEMENT:
