Hon'ble Speaker and Hon'ble Members,

1. I welcome you all to the 7th session of the 12th Manipur Legislative Assembly.
2. I wish all the members a productive and prosperous year ahead.

Law and Order and Justice Delivery

3. Hon'ble Members, with the collective efforts of the Centre and my Government, there has been improvement in the overall law-and-order situation in the State to a larger extent. Except for some sporadic incidents in some sensitive areas, there has been decreasing trend in cases of death, injuries, arson, firing incidents, protests, etc.
4. Currently, 286 companies of CAPF and 137 column of Army and Assam Rifles are deployed along with our State Police to maintain law and order in the State.
5. My Government formally launched implementation of 3 new criminal laws- Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita-2023 (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita-2023 (BNSS) and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhinyam-2023 (BSA) with events held across the state.
6. State level seminar and training programme of master trainers was conducted on implementation of these new laws. Diglot versions were also released in English and Manipuri languages.
7. State Action Plan for Inter-operable Criminal Justice System (ICJS) 2.0 was approved. My Government is in the process of notifying Witness Protection Scheme under Section 398 of BNSS-2023.
8. All possible efforts are being taken to modernize police forces and its infrastructure through various means.
9. Rs. 7.82 crore was approved under Part-V of the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) during 2024-25. Ministry of Home Affairs also allocated plan size of Rs. 4.81 crore under Assistance to States and Union Territories for Modernization of Police Scheme for 2024-2025.

10. Hon'ble Members, under the initiative of War on Drugs 2.0, during the year 2024, Manipur Police seized 11.7 kg of heroin, 10.2 kg of brown sugar, 17.5 kg of opium, 62.9 kg of ganja, 82.6 kg of WY tablets, 195 bottles of cough syrup and 2.3 kg of spasma proxivon capsules, amongst others. 112 persons were arrested and 9 persons convicted. The drugs seized since 2017 are worth approximately Rs. 805 crore in the local market and Rs. 8054 crore in international markets. 816.3 acres of illicit poppy cultivation were destroyed in different parts of the state. A total of 17,081 kg of seized drugs and psychotropic substances along with 14.6 lakh SP capsules and N-10 tablets, WY tablets and pseudoephedrine tablets has been disposed of following due procedure since 2017, which are valued at approximately Rs. 68 crore in local markets and Rs. 687 crore in international markets.
11. Hon'ble Members, my Government had taken up initiatives to reform management of prisons. Procurement for e-prisons has been initiated and Schemes of Poor Prisoners have been implemented.
12. Hon'ble Members, a total allocation of Rs. 45 crore has been earmarked for setting up new fire stations, strengthening of State Training Centre, modernization and to cater to State-specific Demands for setting up of new fire stations.
13. Manipur Forensic Science Laboratory has been upgraded to a full-fledged Directorate. New facilities like DNA Analysis are now functional. MHA sanctioned Rs. 6.16 crore for procurement of equipment and machinery under the scheme – "Modernisation of Forensic Capacities". 2 mobile forensic vans were procured. MHA also approved procurement of another 12 mobile forensic vans with fund allocation of Rs.7.80 crore, out of which 6 have been delivered. 68 police officers were trained in cyber forensic and pending cases have reduced considerably. Currently, we have achieved 99% case disposal in narcotic cases.
14. Manipur Inner Line Permit Guidelines (Amendment) 2024 was notified. Citizen-friendly mobile apps and KIOSK Centers at ILP gates are in advanced stages of development. Manipur State Population Commission is providing assistance and awareness in the implementation of ILP system.
15. Recently, newly recruited personnel of 10 and 11 Indian Reserve Battalions have completed their training at the Dergaon Assam Police Training Centre and they have now been assigned their duties.
16. Emergency Response Support System (ERSS), Manipur are fully functional with One India, One Emergency No. 112.
17. Achievements of Manipur Police Sporting Club (MPSC) are commendable. Ms. Saikhom Mirabai Chanu, Additional SP, representing MPSC won the "Sportstar of the Year" in female category at Sportstar Aces, 2023.

She participated in the Paris Olympic Games, 2024 and stood 4th position in Women's 48 kg Weightlifting event. MPSC won 10 gold medals, 12 silver medals and 9 bronze medals in national events.

18. So far, my Government has identified about 11,000 illegal immigrants in the State and biometric data of about 9,000 have been collected. The biometric data of the illegal immigrants are uploaded on the Foreigners' Identification Portal to take further steps to prevent the illegal immigrants from obtaining Aadhaar and other identity documents. 101 illegal immigrants have been deported to Myanmar in 2024. The remaining 127 illegal immigrants are sheltered in safe shelters, awaiting improvement of situation in Myanmar for deportation.
19. Government of India has decided to fence the entire 398 km of Indo-Myanmar Border in Manipur. Eight packages of 133 km length have been sanctioned so far. Fence construction works have started at multiple sites.
20. My Government has been steadfastly demanding for scraping the Free Movement Regime since long. Government of India has now introduced a new entry and exit system along Indo-Myanmar Border, wherein Myanmar and Indian nationals residing within 10 km from the border can enter into each others' country up to maximum of 10 km by using border pass. Several safeguards are incorporated in the new system including collection of biometrics to prevent settlement of the Myanmar nationals. Eleven entry and exit points have been identified in the State out of which ten have been activated in Phase-I. My Government has taken additional precaution by deputing two police and two health officials at each of the entry points to monitor the entry of Myanmar nationals.
21. Since May 2023, my Government has been taking various initiatives with support of Centre to bring normalcy in the State. There are about 61,353 internally displaced persons belonging to about 11,631 families residing in relief camps and 7,606 persons have now returned to their homes.
22. Various schemes have been rolled out with assistance from MHA and State Budget for the Internally Displaced Persons. MHA approved Special Assistance of Rs. 101.75 crore for operation of relief camps. My Government has already released Rs. 156.35 crore so far. MHA also launched a Scheme for Complementary Nutrition and Personal Hygiene amounting to Rs. 89.22 crore for people living in relief camps. Special Package of Rs. 204.93 crore for providing temporary shelter in 3,000 pre-fabricated houses to internally displaced persons was sanctioned. Construction of 2,660 prefabricated houses have been completed and 2520 units have now been occupied.

23. Scheme for compensatory package for farmers was approved for Rs. 38.60 crore, out of which an amount of Rs 31.67 crore has been released in 2 phases. The scheme has benefitted 5,555 farmers.
24. My Government provided assistance of Rs. 1,000 per person living in relief camps amounting to Rs 23.48 crore for clothing and personal belongings, five times in last 20 months of which Government of India reimbursed Rs. 5.65 crore. Television sets for relief camps at estimated cost of Rs 3.35 crore was provided. Eleven IT centers with 1,100 computers are being established in violence affected districts at a cost of Rs.11 crore to provide facilities for conducting various recruitment examinations as well as to impart computer education.
25. My Government rolled out Permanent Housing Scheme for Displaced Persons whose houses were burnt down and damaged with a target of constructing 5,000 permanent houses in the initial phase at an estimated cost of Rs. 375 crore at the rate of Rs. 10 lakh for pucca houses, Rs. 7 lakh for semi pucca houses and Rs. 5 lakh for kachha houses. 931 houses are under construction.
26. Scheme for relief to people whose houses had been burnt down and damaged had been sanctioned at the rate of Rs. 1 Lakh for 6,000 households amounting to Rs.30 crore. Rs. 25,000/- has been released as 1st installment for 5,270 households so far.
27. Rs 29,34,000/- was released to 326 candidates affected by the law and order situation at the rate of Rs. 9,000 per candidate as allowances for appearing for Civil Services Examination.
28. Next-of-Kin of deceased persons who died in the ethnic violence have been made eligible for ex-gratia of Rs. 5,00,000/- each from the State and Central Government schemes. State Government has released ex-gratia in respect of state share to 221 victims and central share to 210 victims through district administration. As a policy, government jobs are being given to next-of-kin of victims who died in the conflict, on a case-to-case basis.
29. My Government took initiatives to impart training on skill development and income generating livelihood activities for internally displaced persons. Training has been given to 15,000 individuals. My Government released about Rs. 1 crore to procure the items manufactured by them. Special care has also been provided for the elderly, pregnant women and lactating mothers and children.
30. Freight operations at Khongsang railway station was started, bringing in essential commodities like rice, cooking oil and construction materials. Security arrangements including escorts for convoys are made to secure the highways for maintaining uninterrupted supply of goods and services.

31. 16 acts were enacted by the Legislature and 1 ordinance promulgated during 2024.
32. District Court Building at Tamenglong, constructed at a cost of about Rs. 32 crore, was inaugurated. JMFC Court Building at Mao was also inaugurated. Kakching District Court Building is also ready for inauguration.

Healthcare

33. Under Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana, till date, 6,44,370 Ayushman cards have been created and 2,06,959 cases treated amounting to Rs. 280 crore of free treatment. All senior citizens, 70 years or above are now eligible for free medical treatment of upto Rs. 5 lakh under the scheme.
34. Similarly, under Chief Minister Gi Hakshel Gi Tengbang Scheme, 1,24,507 eligible families totaling 3,65,190 beneficiaries have been enrolled. 2,36,597 individuals have been treated amounting to more than Rs. 291 crore of free treatment. These two schemes combined have thus been successful in providing relief from healthcare expenditure to approximately 15% of the State's population.
35. All Internally Displaced Persons are made eligible for CMHT card and health teams are making visits to camps twice weekly.
36. Under the Comprehensive Primary Health Care Scheme, 418 Arogya Aam Mandirs are providing 12 packages of services.
37. State Organ And Tissue Transplantation Organisation was established and was awarded the Best Emerging State in North-East at the 14th Indian Organ Donation Day event.
38. Out of 64 health sub-centres without buildings, work for construction of buildings for 62 centres have started and are targeted for completion by end of the year.
39. During the period, 100% online registration for births and deaths was achieved in the 320 Birth and Death registration units. Aadhar linked birth registration was launched for the first time in the State in Thoubal District.
40. The 100 days Intensified TB Campaign in 347 TB high burden districts of India will continue till March 24, 2025. In Manipur, there are approximately 1,700 TB patients currently on treatment. 6 districts from Manipur, namely Imphal East, Thoubal, Kakching, Chandel, Churachandpur and Kangpokpi are included in the campaign to accelerate the fight against TB. To improve the nutrition of patients, Rs. 1,000 will be given to registered TB patients every month under Nikshay Poshan Yojana and they will also be linked to a Nikshay Mitra for additional support under the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukh Bharat Abhiyan. Since its launch, around 178 Nikshay Mitras or Donors have registered and contributed donations.

41. Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North-East Region (PM-DevINE) was launched to fund infrastructure projects in alignment with PM Gati Shakti while addressing the unique needs of the region. Under the scheme, construction of 60-Bedded Mental Hospital for Rs. 70 crore and Super Specialty Health Care in 5 Hill District hospitals for about Rs. 105 crore has been sanctioned in 2024.

Finance and Planning

42. Manipur made considerable stride in resource mobilization improving its tax-to-GSDP ratio from 2.76% in 2016-17 to 5.16% in 2022-23. This was mainly on account of introduction of Goods and Services Tax in the State and subsequent improvement in its collection. Expenditure on capital outlay as a percentage of Gross State Domestic Product rose from 5.54% in 2017-18 to 9.75 % in 2022-23. This was facilitated by introduction of a new scheme to enhance capital expenditure and investment by the Government of India from financial year 2020-21.
43. Externally Aided Projects funds were also effectively accessed to finance critical infrastructure projects in the State. Currently, 5 projects are under implementation with a total outlay of Rs. 5,450 crore, while 4 projects, with a total outlay of about Rs. 5,900 crore are in the pipeline and planned for implementation in the current year.
44. The unrest that started from May, 2023 has taken a toll on State finances. The State's Own Tax Revenue collection dropped sharply by 35% from Rs. 1,867 crore in 2022-23 to Rs. 1,223 crore in 2023-24. During the current financial year, there is improvement in tax collection, with State GST showing a 5% growth over last year with expectation for further improvement in the coming months.
45. Inflation is a major challenge faced by the State since May, 2023 with disturbance along major supply lines having a direct correlation. With improved situation along major supply lines, retail inflation is expected to ease.
46. Significant amount of expenditure continues to be incurred on security and on relief and rehabilitation of the people affected by the unrest. During 2023-24, expenditure on security increased by 31% over 2022-23. Expenditure towards relief operations take up considerable resources of the State. My Government acknowledges the assistance extended by the Government of India during this period. The State received support from the Central Government for security related expenditure and for meeting expenditure on relief operations, housing, compensatory packages for farmers, etc. The State also received Rs. 500 crore as 'Special Grant for Revenue Loss'. Such timely assistance has been instrumental in enabling the State Government to manage its finances during this critical period.

47. In line with the policy of the Government of India to expedite utilisation of funds of Centrally Sponsored Schemes, my Government has decided to adopt the SNA SPARSH Model to fast track release of funds to implementing agencies and expedite utilization.
48. Dearness Allowance was recently increased for State Government employees from 32% to 39% with effect from 1st January 2025, which will benefit the employees in a big way. Efforts are also being made to ensure that all retirement benefits are cleared within a clear timeframe. Substantial vacancies in government departments have been filled up and more will be filled up wherever required.
49. My Government is continuously exploring multiple avenues to increase State's own resource collection and will focus on increasing productive expenditure, enhancing resource mobilization and fiscal consolidation.
50. The Manipur Start Up Scheme and the Chief Minister's Entrepreneurship Support Scheme were launched to promote StartUps and Entrepreneurs in the State by providing bank credit and subsidies. Till date 9,550 StartUps and MSMEs have been identified for providing support to projects worth Rs. 346 crore.
51. Under "CMESS for Internally Displaced Persons", loan of upto Rs. 50,000/- have been provided bank credit of up to Rs. 50,000/- for setting up and running small businesses to 426 IDPs. 7 successful StartUps and MSMEs have been identified for providing employment to 432 IDPs in their business. The skill development and employment of IDPs has already started. Support of up to Rs. 1 crore will be provided to these successful StartUps.
52. Under "CMESS - One Family One Livelihood", bank credit of up to Rs. 10 lakh will be provided to selected applicants, with a subsidy of 30% of project cost. 745 applicants have been shortlisted and recommended for bank appraisal. 2,755 MSMEs have been provided with bank credit support of Rs. 200 crore since January 2023 under the 'Manipur Credit Guarantee Scheme'. Under the 'Manipur Venture Fund', 2 Startup beneficiaries were identified for provision of equity support of upto Rs. 1.5 crore.
53. Under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) – WDC 2.0, 24 hectares were developed for horticulture crops; 68 water harvesting structures were created; soil and moisture conservation measures were taken up across 25 hectares; 57 Self Help Groups were empowered with seed money of up to Rs. 50,000/- and 354 micro-enterprises were supported with Rs. 20,000/- each across 13 districts spanning 80 villages improving agricultural productivity and community livelihoods.

54. Similarly, under scheme for 'Watershed Management and Sustainable Livelihood' with a project cost of Rs. 6 crore, 24 villages across 12 districts were supported in promoting horticulture over 32 hectares; creating 28 water harvesting structures; and sustainable livelihoods for 296 Self Help Groups.
55. Over 167 projects worth Rs. 1,560 crore have been completed under the Non-Lapsable Central Pool of Resources scheme and 5 projects worth Rs 124 crore were completed under North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme. Some of the new projects include Infrastructure development in schools, Infrastructure development for Polo, and solar power plants, collectively worth Rs. 198 crore.
56. Hill Area Development Program in Tamenglong and Noney districts is creating infrastructure in various sectors such as tourism, connectivity, water supply, education, health. and livelihood activities. 17 projects worth Rs. 43 crore have been completed and another 22 projects worth Rs. 43 crore are nearing completion.

Tribal Affairs, Minorities and SC & OBC Welfare

57. 44,403 ST students are being provided either ST Post-Matric Scholarship or Pre-Matric Scholarship amounting to about Rs. 49 crore.
58. Under the North-Eastern Council funding, construction of Cultural Hall-cum-Multipurpose Building for Senapati District with an estimated cost of Rs. 3.02 crore and construction of Tangkhul Headman's Administration Building at Ukhrul Head Quarter at an estimated cost of Rs. 2.84 crore are expected to be completed by next financial year.
59. During the current financial year, infrastructure development works totalling Rs. 35.49 crore have been taken up in different places of the hill districts of the State under Article 275 (1) of the Constitution funded by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India.
60. Economic and Skill Development Programme is being implemented to provide skill training and assistance in kind. The training program, with a total project cost of Rs. 2.68 crore, will benefit 1,800 beneficiaries, including 900 IDPs belonging to Minority communities, OBC and SC categories.
61. During 2024-25, Rs. 50 crore along with corresponding state matching share of Rs. 5.56 crore was released for implementing various projects under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram. Out of 41 Sadbhavna Mandaps and 1 Common Service Centre, 38 Sadbhavna Mandaps and 1 Common Service Centre have been completed. The remaining 3 Sadbhavna Mandaps at Ukhrul, Chandel and

Tamenglong Districts are nearing completion. 1 Working Women's Hostel at Chandel and 9 Model Residential Schools at Chandel, Tamenglong, Thoubal, Ukhrul, Tengnoupal, Kangpokpi, Senapati and Imphal East Districts are completed.

62. Maintenance, control and management of Model Residential Schools constructed under PMJVK in 13 districts of the State is being entrusted to a dedicated registered Society namely Manipur Model Residential Schools Society under the chairmanship of the Chief Secretary to ensure swift and targeted decision making.
63. Under SASCI Scheme, 6 projects which include 1 Boys' 50-bedded hostel, 1 Girls' 50-bedded hostel for tribals at Maram in Senapati District, 1 Boys' 50-bedded hostel and 1 Girls' 50-bedded hostel at Sarita Boxing Academy at Imphal West District, Indigenous Sports Complex at Senapati and Haj House at Lilong are in various stages of construction.
64. Under Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan, Rs. 21.95 crore has been approved, which include interventions for income generation, skill development, and infrastructure. During 2024-25, Rs.1.43 crore was released for construction of 3 community halls-cum-market sheds at Khurkhul Makha Awang Leikai and Kharam Koireng in Imphal West and Nongmaikhong in Bishnupur.
65. 26,645 OBC and SC students were given scholarships amounting to Rs. 18.26 crore during 2023-24. For the academic year 2024-25, online scrutiny of scholarship applications is currently underway on the National Scholarship Portal.
66. Under Scheme for Construction of Hostels for OBC Boys and Girls, 3 girls' 100-bedded hostels at Kebol High School, G.P. Women's College and Liberal College and 1 boys' 100-bedded hostel at Heingang High School was completed during 2024-25. 2 Boys' 100-bedded hostels at Sainik School, Imphal are currently under construction.

Food Security

67. Hon'ble Members, rice is provided free of cost to all beneficiaries under National Food Security Act. The Government of India has further extended the facility till 31st December 2028.
68. Government of India has permitted to indent rice under OMSS (D) on payment basis as per requirement by district authorities for distribution in the relief camps for 2024-25 as well. To initiate the process for procurement of local paddy for distribution under NFSA, a rice mill having 2 MT per hour capacity is being constructed at a cost of Rs. 13.47 crore.

69. 2,24,999 beneficiaries benefitted under Ujjwala 1.0 and Ujjwala 2.0.

Education

70. In pursuance of provisions under National Education Policy, 2020, colleges of Manipur introduced 4-year Undergraduate Programme with Choice Based Credit System with effect from 2022-23 academic session.
71. 41 out of 51 Government and Government Aided Colleges of Manipur have been accredited under National Assessment and Accreditation Council.
72. Chief Minister's Award for Educational Excellence was launched to award 8 best performing Government and Government Aided Colleges of Manipur.
73. Chief Minister's College Students Rehabilitation Scheme was launched in 2023 to help displaced students of higher education institutions. A total of 988 students benefitted under the scheme in 2023-24 and is being continued in 2024-25 as well.
74. College Fagathansi Mission was also launched to develop infrastructure and equip colleges with laboratory, computers and furniture. Classroom blocks are under construction in 24 government colleges at a cost of Rs. 2.5 crore per college in phase-I.
75. Under Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (PM-USHA) Rs. 85 crore was approved for development of infrastructures and resources in colleges of Manipur in the next 3 years.
76. Chief Minister's Scholarship Scheme for Civil Services Aspirants continue to provide free class-room coaching to 200 selected civil services aspirants every year. Rs. 2.80 crore is earmarked per year and faculty from Delhi are stationed at Imphal on rotational basis for conducting physical classes for selected students.
77. To uphold academic integrity, Dhanamanjuri University implemented the Drill Bit Software to check plagiarism. Under Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Programme, mandatory 10-day online training for 100 teachers will be conducted in collaboration with NIEPA, Delhi.
78. Under PM-DevINE Scheme, the Government of India has given recommendation-in-principle for "Infrastructure Development for Dhanamanjuri University" with a total cost of Rs. 70 crore. Construction of 2 buildings for Civil Engineering Department and Electrical Engineering Department under project for "Infrastructure Development of Manipur Technical University" has also commenced under the scheme at a total cost of Rs. 54.16 crore.

79. The Manipur Technical University is providing regular offline classes at its campus and online classes for those students who are not able to attend at campus due to the prevailing situation.
80. Chief Minister's Teacher Achievement Award is being instituted to incentivise and motivate government school teachers to work harder.
81. The State Competitive Scholarship for students was extended to Class III passed students from 2024-25 and the rate of scholarship for Class V passed students and class VIII passed students were enhanced.
82. Chief Minister's Coaching Scheme for Entrance Examination to Professional Courses was instituted to provide free coaching to 30 selected students each for Joint Entrance Examination for admission to engineering courses and National Eligibility cum Entrance Test for admission to medical courses.
83. With the introduction of School Fagathansi Mission in 2019, results in public examinations also saw a marked improvement. The pass percentage of High School Leaving Certificate Examination-2024 was the highest in the history of Manipur with a pass percentage of 84.34% and for Higher Secondary Examination- 2024 the pass percentage was 95.49%. First and second position holders in Commerce stream and second position holder in Arts stream for Higher Secondary Examination 2024 were Government school students. "Know Your Manipur" book was launched to highlight and create greater awareness of the rich history, vibrant culture, and unique identity of Manipur.
84. My Government have directed all Government and Government Aided colleges to have daily "Assembly" of students and staff which has improved the attendance of students in the colleges. The Assembly includes "Thought for the Day" speech by students and teachers on important current topics, singing of National Anthem and State Song.

Power Sector

85. My Government is committed to providing 24x7 power supply to urban areas and around 23 hours per day power supply to rural areas in the state. Requirement of power in the state was 775 Million Units and peak demand was 276 Megawatt, which has been met by purchasing power from various generating power plants and the Indian Energy Exchange.
86. For lighting important areas of the state, 74 high masts have been installed throughout the state with another 40 high masts in pipeline.
87. To further enhance the consumers' experience, Unified Billing System is being implemented.

88. The AT&C Loss for 2023-24 was 15.09%, achieving the target of 12-15% as envisioned in Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme by 2024-25.
89. Implementation of Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme (RDSS), Manipur was sanctioned amounting to Rs. 520.61 crore with Gross Budgetary Support of Rs. 398.67 crore for execution till 2025-26 to improve quality, reliability and affordability of power supply to consumers.
90. The project for Electrification of Left-out Households in the State at a cost of Rs. 224.89 crore with Gross Budgetary Support of Rs. 190.14 crore was also sanctioned.
91. To increase solar rooftop capacity, PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana is being implemented for installation of on-grid solar roof-top system for residential consumers of the state. 2,653 consumers registered and 620 applications were submitted for installation of solar roof-top, out of which 104 systems have been commissioned. Under NESIDS, Rs. 33.39 crore has been sanctioned for 600 kW grid connected SPV power plant at 132/33 kV Elangkhangpokpi Power Sub-Station; 800 kW grid connected SPV power plant at 132/33 kV Kakching Power Sub-station and 5 MW floating grid connected Solar Power Plant at Thoubal Multipurpose Project Reservoir near Chadong Village.
92. New transmission projects are being taken up for people living in remotest areas to have access to grid power.
93. At present, 19 new 33/11 kV sub-stations with total capacity of 186.3 MVA and 2 new 132/33 kV sub-stations with total capacity of 60 MVA are under construction. Further, the 132 kV Ring Main Double Circuit of the state and important 33 kV transmission lines supplying power to Imphal area are being replaced with High Temperature Low Sag Conductors to double the transmission capacities during the next five years.

Agriculture and Allied Activities and Natural Resources

94. 6.20 lakh farmers have been enrolled under PM-KISAN and about Rs. 853 crore were released till date.
95. Under RKVY-RAFTAAR, construction of one permanent ATMA building at District Agriculture Office, Imphal West was started with an estimated cost of Rs. 1.2 crore. 22 agro market sheds with a sitting capacity of 50 were constructed at a cost of Rs. 5.50 crore.
96. Under PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop, 1,450 small and marginal farmers were provided financial assistance for procurement of sprinkler sets with water pump-set, to provide supplementary irrigation to 1,450 hectares.

97. 10,000 Soil Health Cards were distributed to promote micro nutrients on 10,100 hectares.
98. Under value addition link production projects, 1,183 farmers were provided financial assistance for purchase of knapsack sprayers and 1,900 power sprayers.
99. Under Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana, 4,588 farmers enrolled during Kharif 2024. In Rabi 2023-24, 496 farmers were enrolled covering an area of about 434 hectares.
100. Under Sub Mission on Agriculture Mechanization, financial assistance was provided to 456 individual farmers for procurement of farm machineries and equipment and to 52 groups for "Establishment of Farm Machinery Bank and Custom Hiring Service Centre".
101. 2,633 beneficiaries benefitted under National Mission on Edible Oil -Oilseeds for 2023-24 implemented during 2024-25.
102. Under National Mission on Edible Oil & Oil Palm, Annual Action Plan for 2023-24 and 2024-25 was approved for area expansion of 1,200 and 1,500 hectares respectively. Efforts are in place to identify land for production of planting materials and for setting up processing plants at Thoubal and Imphal West districts.
103. Farmer Producer Companies formed under the Central Scheme Mission Organic Value Chain Development for Northeast Region marketed 400 MT of Black Aromatic Rice outside the state generating revenue of Rs. 2.2 crore for the farmers. Additionally, a buyback agreement with a firm outside the state for chia seeds cultivated across 50 hectares is expected to generate an income of about Rs. 50 lakh during 2025.
104. Under the NEC project "Promotion of Smallholder's Value Chain System for Kiwi Cultivation in Manipur," kiwi cultivation was expanded by 90 hectares in Senapati and Ukhrul District. Plantation of Tree Bean and Tamenglong Orange has been expanded covering an area of 37 hectares and 152 hectares under NEC funding.
105. Under the 'Market Intervention' scheme, Rs. 1 crore was disbursed to 1,006 identified farmers whose horticulture crops were completely damaged by hailstorm.
106. A contingency plan was implemented to support 3,609 farmers affected by the unrest and natural calamities by providing quality vegetable seeds and planting materials. Under 'Initiative for Livelihood Revival of Unemployed Youths and Farmers', Rabi seeds were distributed to 3,761 small and marginal farmers and unemployed youths affected by the ongoing crisis across the state.

This program covered approximately 470 hectares of fallow land during the Rabi season.

107. Under the SASCI scheme, construction of 5 cold storage units at Naransena in Bishnupur District, Makuilongdi in Senapati District, Lunghar in Ukhrul District, Paorei in Ukhrul District and Progeny Orchard Cum Nursery Farm in Lamlenkhun in Jiribam.
108. Under the Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture, hybrid vegetable seeds were distributed to cover an area of 1,420 hectares, along with establishment of 100 hectares of new banana tissue culture plantations. Additionally, 160 farm ponds were provided to individuals for water storage, and 75 pack houses were constructed to support post-harvest management.
109. To provide veterinary services at the doorsteps, 33 Mobile Veterinary Ambulances and a Toll-Free Call Centre was launched. Since its launch in July till December of 2024, 2,191 calls were received, 1,632 cases physically attended and 559 cases consulted over call.
110. To facilitate extending government benefits directly to pony owners, registration of the Manipuri Pony was launched under the Manipuri Pony Conservation and Development Policy.
111. 21st Livestock Census, 2024 was launched to collect data of 16 species of animals including poultry birds. Livestock insurance was launched to manage life risks and uncertainties. The rabies out-break in March last year was brought under control immediately.
112. MoU was signed to transfer Manipur Milk Producers' Cooperative Union Ltd. to National Dairy Development Board to strengthen the dairy industry and milk production in Manipur.
113. Under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana, benefits were provided to 2,624 fish farmers during 2024-25 by establishing various freshwater fin fish hatcheries, rearing ponds, grow out ponds, new ponds, cages in reservoirs, biofloc culture system, etc.
114. The annual fish production went up to 45,000 metric tonnes against the demand for 67,500 metric tonnes resulting in an estimated reduction of about Rs. 3 crore on import cost from outside the state.
115. During the year, Government of Manipur scripted history becoming the first state in India to achieve scientific breakthrough in induced breeding of Sareng fish, the most cherished fish in Manipur. The Revival Project of Sareng will conserve endangered indigenous fish species.

116. Project for “Integrated Management Plan for Wise Use of Loktak Lake” was approved under National Plan for Conservation of Aquatic Ecosystem with an estimated cost of Rs. 145 crore to ensure ecological integrity of Loktak including protection of its boundary from encroachment.
117. Under the National River Conservation Plan, rejuvenation and conservation of the Nambul River is being undertaken. Waste water generated through 72 drains from Imphal Municipal area nearby Nambul River are collected and diverted to two sewerage treatment plants at Heirangoithong Maibam Leikai and Iroisemba. For rejuvenation and conservation of Imphal-Manipur river, Rs. 10 crore was also sanctioned.
118. Climate Resilient Spring Shed Management for better water security and maintenance of e-flow of rivers under Climate Change Adaptation Programme has been developed as pilot village at Lunghar village, Ukhrul District and being extended to 10 villages in various districts.
119. 7 wetlands have been recommended for notification under the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017. Wetland rejuvenation and conservation activities at Yaral Pat, Waithou-Phumnom Pat, Ultra Pat and Jaimeng Lake for a project cost of Rs. 76.60 crore were taken up since 2022 and about 50% of the overall work is completed.
120. Under the “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” initiative, launched by Hon’ble Prime Minister in 2024-25, approximately 40 lakh seedlings have already been planted and is on track for the target set of 50 lakh till 31.03.2025
121. The aggressive plantation drive undertaken during last 7 years resulted in a 30% increase in the growing stock of trees.

Water Resources and Management

122. Under Extension Renovation & Modernization, Loktak Lift Irrigation Project with a total cost of Rs. 81.59 crore is being implemented to restore irrigation potential of 17,400 hectares. So far, overall physical progress of 79.32% was achieved resulting in the restoration of 15,210 hectares of irrigation potential.
123. Under Dam Rehabilitation and Improvement Project, Phase-II and III for rehabilitation, improvement and for comprehensive and sustainable dam and barrage operations, 5 projects were taken up for a total of Rs. 311 crore. The rehabilitation and improvement of Singda Dam and Imphal Barrage has achieved an overall progress of 68.12% and 42.40% respectively and are targeted for completion by December, 2026.
124. Manipur witnessed three major floods owing to Cyclone Remal and the onset of the seasonal monsoon during 2024-25, leading to extensive and widespread

damage and displacement. To mitigate flooding, project for “Critical Flood Control and Anti-erosion Works along Rivers in Manipur River Basin” amounting to Rs. 460.42 crore is being implemented. Preparation of Master Plan of Manipur River Basin taken up by the Brahmaputra Board which would help in designing a long-term flood management programme, is in its final stages.

125. “Rejuvenation of Lamphelpat Water body to alleviate Urban Flooding, providing sustainable Water Sources for Imphal City and Promoting Eco-Tourism” is being implemented with EAP funding of Rs. 650 crore from New Development Bank.
126. Under the National Hydrology Project, a State Water Informatics Centre of Manipur has been set up to act as a data repository centre. The project is targeted for completion by September, 2025.

Water Supply

127. Hon’ble Members, various projects are being implemented for potable water supply in the state under various funding sources for a total estimated cost of about Rs. 4,300 crore.
128. Under Jal Jeevan Mission, 79.59% rural households and 90% urban households have been provided with functional household tap connections and pipe water supply.
129. Integrated Sewerage System for City of Imphal Phase-II at an estimated cost of about Rs. 1,255 crore for sewerage collection and treatment of 16 IMC wards is also being implemented with NDB funding.

Works

130. Infrastructure Development of Kamjong at a cost of Rs. 17 crore and Manipur Bhawan at Salt Lake, Kolkata were completed at a cost of Rs. 30 crore.
131. Improvement of Roads within Imphal City with Rigid Pavement is being taken up under Externally Aided Projects at a cost of about Rs. 3,622 crore. Construction of Imphal Ring Road at a cost of Rs 1,660 crore is also being taken up under EAP.
132. Construction of Rigid Pavement with thin white topping and interlocking paver blocks in Hill District Headquarters at a cost of about Rs. 174 crore is being taken up under funding from SASCI scheme.
133. Widening and improvement of Shangshak Tengnoupal Road into 2 lanes with hard shoulder in Manipur is being taken up to connect NH-102 and NH-202. Package-1 and Package-3 of the project totaling about Rs. 1,280 crore received sanction. FDPR for Packages 2 and 4 totaling about Rs. 1,859 crore have been submitted for sanction.

134. Imphal-Kangchup-Tamenglong Road at a cost of Rs. 1,437.44 crore with financial assistance from Asian Development Bank is under construction.
135. Improvement of 92 roads amounting to Rs. 314.39 crore are also being taken up under Central Road Infrastructure Fund.

Transport

136. For convenience of people in the state traveling outside by air, additional flights were launched under Viability Gap Funding by State Government on three routes to Kolkata, Guwahati and Dimapur operating twice weekly at subsidized rate.
137. Since its launch in 2018, Manipur Heli Service continues to service 8 routes connecting people in hilly and interior parts of the state. To ease and facilitate transport of those affected by the unrest, helicopter service on Imphal-Churachandpur-Aizwal route was increased from once to twice in a week. Similarly, Imphal-Jiribam and Imphal-Lairouching-Dimapur routes help ease transport needs of the people. In addition to these routes, 3 other helicopter routes are operated under Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - UDAN 2.0. During the law-and-order crisis, our helicopter services made a total of 1,060 sorties carrying 12,727 passengers between Imphal and destinations at Jiribam, Churachandpur, Aizwal, Moreh, Kangpokpi, Dimapur and Ukhrul.

Urban Planning and Development

138. Under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna (Urban), construction for 55,804 houses were sanctioned, out of which 14,731 houses have been completed. Demand assessment in all 27 Urban Local Bodies has been started for implementing PMAY-U 2.0.
139. Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Urban Livelihoods Mission is being implemented to reduce poverty and vulnerability of the urban poor. A Shelter for Urban Homeless was constructed and made functional.
140. Under PM SVANidhi, loans to 13,951 street vendors have been disbursed since its launch.
141. Under Swachh Bharat Mission (U) 2.0, establishment of Wet Waste Processing Facilities in all 27 Urban Local Bodies was approved. Construction of compost pit is completed in 8 ULBs and ongoing in 14 ULBs. For management of used water, 10 cesspools were procured and distributed to 10 ULBs. Construction of 30 Normal Public Toilets with total 111 seats, 6 Aspirational Public Toilets with total 29 seats and 33 Public Urinals with total 121 seats was approved.
142. Property tax in all 27 Urban Local Bodies is targeted for implementation with effect from 1stApril, 2025.

143. Till date under Imphal Smart City project, sixteen projects amounting to about Rs. 85 crore has been completed and 6 projects costing Rs. 334 crore are nearing completion, while 3 projects costing about Rs. 92 crore are in various stages of work.
144. Water Supply, Rejuvenation of Water Bodies and Parks projects worth about Rs. 160 crore was approved under Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation 2.0. Works are in progress for 18 Water Body Rejuvenation projects. GIS-based Master Plans are being prepared for 6 towns under AMRUT 2.0 with 100% Central Assistance. For the remaining 21 towns and 14 District Headquarters and Moreh, preparation of GIS-based Master Plans is in progress from the State fund. "Risk Informed Master Plan" and "Comprehensive City Mobility Plan" for Imphal and Thoubal have been notified.

Rural Development

145. Since launching of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme in the State, 6.18 lakh families have benefitted as of 31 December, 2024 generating 148.84 lakh person-days. The average of days of employment provided for 2023-24 was 31.19 days as compared to national average of 52.08 days, which is a significant achievement considering the prevailing law and order situation in the State.
146. To bring greater transparency, various systems have been adopted including payment of wages, material and administrative expenses through banks and GIS-based management system to maintain information of MGNREGA assets.
147. During 2024-25, 8 roads and bridge works with a road length of only 29 km could be completed under PMGSY. Cumulatively, out of 2,124 works sanctioned to cover 11,673 km of road length, 1,919 works was completed under PMGSY-I & II. In principle approval has been obtained for construction of 812.50 km of road length under PMGSY-III for the State.
148. Under PMAY-G, against a target of 37,676 houses, 30,467 houses are completed. Approval for construction of 7,000 houses during 2024-25 was received under PMAY-G Special Package for those families which have been affected due to the unrest.
149. Under Deen Dayal Upadhyaya-Grameen Kaushal Yojana, 6,910 candidates from various districts have been trained and 4,260 candidates placed in regular employment.

Social Welfare

150. Under Ima Nongthangleima Yaipha Tengbang Scheme, special drives were organised where 514 eligible Internally Displaced Persons were identified and

Rs. 500/- per month per beneficiary was disbursed for 3 months. In addition to this, 45,485 applicants have been recommended by the State Selection Committee and benefits will be disbursed before the end of 2024-25.

151. "Shelter and Livelihood Centre for Widows" at Luwangasangbam in Imphal East is being constructed at a cost of Rs. 8 crore for providing shelter to widows who lack social, financial or emotional support systems. To provide safe and secure accommodation for women seeking employment, construction of 10 Working Women Hostels at a cost of Rs. 149 crore will be taken up under SASCI 2024-25 at Lamphel, Churachandpur, Kangpokpi, Iroishemba, Jiribam, Kakching, Senapati, Tamenglong, Moirang and Ukhrul.
152. Rs. 2 crore was approved under the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) during 2024-25 for construction of "Drug De-addiction Centre" at Ukhrul for those needing professional support to overcome substance use disorders.
153. Under Mission Vatsalya Scheme, 2,828 destitute children are being provided shelter in 86 Child Care Institutions.
154. 5 victims from Imphal East District and 7 victims from Thoubal District were given financial assistance amounting to Rs. 22 lakh under "Financial Assistance and Support Service to Victims of Rape: A Scheme for Restorative Justice."

Labour Welfare, Employment Generation and Entrepreneurship

155. The State Government is taking due care for welfare of the working population. So far, 6,035 un-organized workers are enrolled under Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan National Pension Scheme and 4.53 lakh on e-SHRAM Portal.
156. Government ITI, Sekmai started its first academic session in 2024-25. More than 100 students were placed under various campus placements. Manipur participated in India Skills Competition, 2024. Participants from the state won Gold Medal in bakery and another received Medallion for Excellence in Electrical Installation.
157. Under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana 4.0, 6,061 internally displaced persons were selected to participate in skill development training and secure livelihood opportunities were facilitated.
158. Under Skill Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness Livelihood Promotion, skill development training was imparted to 100 SC/ST women.

Textiles, Commerce, and Industries

159. In order to promote handloom and handicrafts products of Manipur, the Chief Minister Yarn Scheme was introduced in 2024-25 to provide benefit to 3.18 lakh handloom weavers and artisans in Manipur by providing subsidy of up to 20% in addition to central subsidy of 15%.
160. Manipur participated in the HATHKARGHA 2024 Business Mission to UAE which facilitated framing of the Export Acceleration Mission for handloom and handicrafts products of Manipur. This mission will benefit 1 lakh weavers and artisans of Manipur directly in the years to come.
161. A roadmap was framed to support 53,000 handloom weavers of all districts of Manipur under National Handloom Development Programme with a total outlay of Rs. 129.67 crore during 2021-22 to 2024-25.
162. Establishment of new industrial estates in the districts of Senapati and Imphal East at a project cost of Rs.21.94 crore was approved.
163. Under SASCI, Rs. 36 crore was sanctioned for construction of 40 additional infrastructure units in the Industrial Estates of Tera Urak in Bishnupur District and Salemthar in Chandel District and three Effluent Treatment Plants at existing Industrial Estates in Imphal West, Bishnupur and Kakching districts.
164. The Khadi and Village Industry Commission, has set a target of 665 projects in Manipur under Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme with a margin money of Rs.18.21 crore to generate employment of 7,315 persons during 2024-25.
165. For construction of Unity Mall at Nilakuthi, Imphal under SASCI scheme, Rs. 74.50 crore was released as first instalment.

Tourism

166. To celebrate the rich cultural heritage of the State while fostering unity and understanding among all communities, the 1st Manipur Indigenous People's Cultural Exchange Festival 2024 was celebrated at Chadong in Kamjong District under the theme "Manipur - United by Diversity". The 4th State Level Barak festival was celebrated in Kathiko Karong under the theme 'Preserve & Cherish'.
167. In the 2nd edition of the Best Tourism Villages Competition, Andro clinched the prestigious title of Best Tourism Village in the Heritage category.
168. Project for development of "Loktak Lake Experience" was approved with a total project cost of Rs. 89.48 crore under SASCI for 2024-25 to develop Iconic Resort at Moirang, Eco Adventure components at Thanga and Water based Eco Adventure activities with floating cafeteria at Takmu area.

169. Development of Barak Heritage Festival and Tourism Infrastructure at Koide Biisho Village, Senapati, Manipur was approved by NEC with a project cost of Rs. 4.41 crore in 2024-25.
170. Lease deed was signed for construction and development of the existing Hotel Imphal infrastructure into 5 Star Category and to operate and maintain the assets on PPP mode.

Sports

171. Manipur U-17 boys' football team made history by winning the 63rd Subroto Cup International Football Tournament. In women's football, Manipur emerged as the champion in the Senior Women's National Football Championship for the 23rd time. At the 68th National School Games, the boys' team achieved a significant milestone by clinching the team championship title in the U-14 Swimming Championship.
172. To ensure the continued success of our athletes, 'One Village, One Playground' initiative was launched. This pilot project aims to develop one playground in every assembly constituency, providing a platform for grassroots-level talent scouting and fostering a sporting culture in every corner of the state. The 'Chief Minister's Sports Person Livelihood Guarantee Scheme' is another initiative to provide livelihood opportunities to unemployed sportspersons in recognition of having represented the state or nation at professional levels.
173. Government of India approved construction of 11 football grounds in the State and the Manipur Football Academy. Approval was also given under NESID OTRI for construction of one Multipurpose Indoor Stadium at Khuman Lampak. Construction of football field with RCC Gallery at 8 Blocks of Manipur at a cost of Rs. 16.64 crore are taken up under "Khelo India", out of which 2 were inaugurated and 2 others are ready for inauguration. Under the same scheme, swimming pool with RCC Gallery at Bishnupur at a cost of Rs. 5 crore and construction of Multi-purpose Hall at Mayang Imphal at about Rs. 6 crore are also being taken up.
174. 26 Khelo India District Centres have been operationalized under the Khelo India Scheme to help identify and nurture young talent, ensuring every aspiring athlete has access to top-notch training and facilities.

Arts & Culture

175. Tiranga Concerts, Tiranga Selfie and Tiranga Canvas were organized as part of Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.

176. Artistes and officials from Manipur participated in the NAMASTE VIETNAM FESTIVAL at Ho Chi Minh City to showcase our rich cultural heritage and different art forms.
177. Group Art Exhibition was organised at Guwahati to give Manipuri artists a platform at the national level and various cultural programmes were also held at Kolkata and Agartala. Memorandum of Understanding for Cultural Exchange Programmes was signed with Government of Uttar Pradesh.
178. Public has now access to the historical monuments at Langthabal Old Palace, paving the way to develop a world class tourist destination. A documentary film entitled Chahi Taret Khuntakpa was made and screened on the death anniversary of Maharaja Ghambir Singh to revive and ignite a sense of patriotism and sacrifices for the nation.
179. Under Chief Minister's Artistessingis Tengbang, 891 artistes benefitted from pension in the year 2024-25; 1 cultural team was provided support for International and National Festival Participation; financial assistance was extended to 148 cultural organisations for Training with New Production; 21 persons have been granted financial assistance for book publication, instrument and costume making workshop; 286 students benefitted from assistance for purchasing instruments and 6 National Awardees benefitted under the Scheme of Award to Distinguished Artistes.
180. Dr. Ratan Thiyam who is a renowned international figure and eminent personality was conferred the Life Time Achievement Award for his excellence and contribution towards preservation and promotion of art and culture.
181. Eikhoigi Imphal International Film Festival was held showcasing films from Manipur and international films as well.
182. Under PM-DevINE, infrastructure development works for Manipur University of Culture has been sanctioned at a cost of Rs. 31.18 crore.
183. Physical progress is about 70% for the construction of Manipur Institute of Performing Arts, Gurgaon.
184. Ministry of DoNER has approved sanction of Rs. 14.76 crore for "Infrastructure Development of Heritage Complex Rajbari". 20% of the work is already completed.

GAD

185. To facilitate hassle-free citizen-government interactions, State Secretariat adopted 'Swagatam', a process of scheduling appointments through a cloud-based application for citizens seeking to meet government officials.

186. 'Online Inventory Management System' for proper and transparent management of store items was implemented successfully.
187. Radio Frequency Identification Based Identity Card were rolled out for employees of Manipur Secretariat.

Relief & Disaster Management

188. Scheme for implementation of Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction is being implemented and Strengthening of District Disaster Management Authorities for hazard prone districts out of 115 identified backward districts.
189. About 4,000 participants were imparted training on various issues related to Disaster Management. Under the scheme for Up-scaling Aapda Mitra Scheme, 800 selected community volunteers are trained on various disaster related issues.
190. My Government made immediate provisions of high quality CGI sheets to about 50,000 households affected by unprecedented hailstorm in My, 2024 at a cost of about Rs. 45 crore.
191. My Government also released Rs. 30 crore for providing immediate relief to flood affected households in the aftermath of Cyclone Remal and heavy monsoon rains.

Administrative Reforms & DP

192. The Manipur Staff Selection Commission has been made functional with appointment of a Chairperson.

Information Technology

193. Since 2020, e-Office was implemented across the entire State Government to ensure transparency and efficiency. It is now being extended to 40 colleges and schools under the government. This measure enabled the government officials to continue their work remotely during the crisis.
194. IT Special Economic Zone is being set up towards developing a dynamic IT industry in Manipur. As part of IT-SEZ, World Bank Funding for Manipur Infotech eNabled Development (MIND) Project was conceived. With a cost of Rs. 418 crore, the project will promote digital skills and entrepreneurship. The Project is now at the Legal Loan Signing stage. Building No. 1 in IT-SEZ processing zone is complete and ready for inauguration. The building is expected to accommodate 1,000-seater BPO Centre, State Data Centre and Security Operations Centre, and co-working space for interested local firms. Building No. 2 has secured funding approval of Rs.120 crore under the PM-DevINE. Construction works for 154 residential apartments complex is ongoing. To promote innovation, entrepreneurship and to train youths on latest technologies,

Centre for Invention, Innovation, Incubation and Training (CIIT) is being set up in the Non-Processing Zone of IT SEZ. Physical structure of Technology Lab has been completed. Construction of Manipur Technology Innovation HUB Shed is completed and interior works are at finishing stage. Currently, it is operating from Manipur IT Park, through which 50 Startups were incubated with 13 securing various government fundings amounting to Rs. 3.88 crore in different areas including new businesses of freshwater pearl farming and banana fibre products.

Sericulture

195. Under Silk Samagra II, 4 sericulture projects are being implemented to provide employment opportunities in the sericulture sector to over 2,000 beneficiaries. During the period, about 490 farmers were provided assistance and about 403 imparted training.

Land Resources

196. Payment of land revenue online is now made possible for all land which have been computerised.
197. Land acquisitions for major developmental works are accorded priority. Land acquisition is being taken up for erection of fencing and construction of road along Indo-Myanmar Border.
198. Digitisation of cadastral maps has been completed for over 90% of available maps. The process is ongoing for integration of the digitised maps with existing land records to allow transparent identification and verification of plots of land

Cooperation

199. 299 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) adopted Model Bye Laws allowing them to engage in multiple activities. Further, 140 PACS in the state have been approved and given license to act as fertilizer retailers. 40 of these PACS have been upgraded to Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samridhi Kendras.
200. Under the Scheme for establishment of new multipurpose PACS in the uncovered panchayats and villages, 67 new multipurpose PACS were formed in the State.
201. Under National Cooperative Development Pisciculture Project, 163 fishery cooperative societies from 4 districts were given Rs. 20.87 crore as fishery loan.

Election

202. 18th General Elections to Lok Sabha was held successfully. 94 Special Polling Stations were setup in 10 districts for electors displaced or staying in relief camps. 18,620 displaced electors opted to vote at such Special Polling Stations, out of which 10,664 electors casted their votes.
203. Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls, 2025 with respect to 01.01.2025 was conducted successfully. There are about 20.54 lakh electors in the status of Photo Electoral Rolls in the state with 29,468 new electors, including 13,305 electors in the age group of 18-19 years and names of 9,741 electors were deleted after following due procedures due to various reasons.
204. The State Election Commission is currently considering for scheduling dates for conducting election to local bodies, in consultation with State Government.

IPR

205. The grant for the All Manipur Working Journalists' Union was raised from Rs. 3 lakh to Rs. 5 lakh for 2023-2024. An additional grant of Rs. 1 lakh was sanctioned for the Manipur Hill Journalists' Union in Churachandpur. In collaboration with All Manipur Working Journalists' Union, tour was organised to Kalapani Memorial at Port Blair with participation of 30 women journalists.

Science & Technology

206. 1 week Entrepreneurship Development Programme on Livelihood Training and on "Food Science and Technology" was conducted for 200 unemployed women in various parts of the state.
